This Manifesto is a public call to deliberate and act on technological development signed by over 1000 leaders worldwide.




ABOUT

In this edition of the summer school we aim to cover



Use cases of AI-based tools in public service in practice

- Impact on work-related skills, expectations & understanding of the objectives and tasks of a public servant
- Imagine you are working for a public body at EU or national level and should use the AI-Based Multilingual Services, like eBriefing and eSummary, to assist with your work
- Real-life scenarios will be introduced by the experts. Students will explore specific Al
 tools, and come up with practical solutions to questions such as:
 - How would you perform your tasks?
 - What opportunities and risks do you see?
 - What would really help your work and what would cause negative stress for you?
 - When the focus is put on reviewing instead of drafting, how does it change the nature of your work and the skills needed?
 - Who may benefit the most from using Al-assisted tools?






Social Dinner
